RELEASE TIME:

All articles to be left in place until Sunday, August 3rd, at which time they will be released from 12 noon to 3:00 p.m. No articles are to be removed before this release time, unless in certain baked good categories. The Greene County Agricultural Society will not be responsible for any articles remaining after Sunday, August 3, 2008 after 3:00 p.m. as they may be subject to disposal.

RULES:

1. A 2008 Exhibitor's Ticket, price \$30.00 is required to enter unless entrant holds a 2008 Greene County Agricultural Society Membership.
- Those persons exhibiting a total of five (5) or less items and/or vegetables (animals excluded) in Departments 7 and 8 may purchase a Mini-Exhibitor Ticket for \$15.00
- This ticket will also admit exhibitor to the fair on two occasions. Exhibitors entering more than five (5) entries in those two (2) Departments will be required to purchase a 2008 Exhibitor's Ticket OR a 2008 Membership in the Greene County Agricultural Society at a cost of \$25.00. A fee of \$10.00 must be paid by 4-H or FFA members entering this department.
- A Membership Ticket or 4-H/FFA Ticket allows ticket holder to exhibit an unlimited number of items in ANY department of the Greene County Fair and gives the holder admission to the fair each day.
2. **This department is open to residents of Greene as well as all surrounding counties.**
3. All articles in this department must be in the MERCANTILE BUILDING ON THURSDAY, JULY 24th between the hours of 9:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. except for baking. (see that class)
4. Entries may be made in as many classes as desired, but only ONE entry per exhibitor in each book entry.
5. This department reserves the right to reject any article soiled, stained or because of size and/or content.
6. Where articles are of inferior quality, the judges shall refuse to award premiums even though there is no competition, and in any case where articles are not deemed worthy of first premium, judges shall not award higher than second premium. The entry must be of sufficient merit to warrant an award of any kind.
7. All entry tags must be attached securely to each entry.

8. The Fair Board will do everything possible to see that articles are properly protected, but can assume no obligation for loss or damage. At the discretion of the building superintendents and/or judges, they may dispose any item not worthy to keep.

9. Directions on rules must be followed in all categories as entry will be disqualified.

10. Entries in all classes to be made and completed by exhibitor. AMATEURS ONLY, NO PROFESSIONALS.

11. Premium checks are printed from the entry form filled out by the exhibitor. Entry form must contain current information so that checks may be mailed to exhibitor's home.

12. "Best of Show" winners will receive an additional \$5.00.

In addition, a \$50.00, \$40.00, \$30.00, and \$20.00 gift certificates will be given for the 2nd through 5th place winner, respectively. The gift certificates will be to a local grocery store. All entries must be in the proper location for judging by 10:00 A.M., Tuesday, July 29th wrapped in Saran Wrap. One wedge of cake and pie from each exhibit will be left on display until Wednesday night. Prizes will be awarded at 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday evening. Cakes and pies may be picked up after 5:15 P.M. on Tuesday evening.

APPLE PIE

3 cups sifted flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup lard
6 tablespoons cold water

Mix flour, salt and lard until mixture is crumbly. Add water a little at a time, blending lightly. Dough should be moist enough to cling together. It should not be sticky. Shape enough dough in smooth ball with hands and roll out bottom crust, fold dough in half and fit into lightly floured pie plate. Roll out top crust same as the bottom.

FILLING FOR APPLE PIE

6 cups thinly sliced peeled apples (a cooking apple)
1 cup sugar
1 tablespoon cornstarch
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1 or 2 tablespoons butter

Mix dry ingredients together lightly with apples in bowl. Put filling in unbaked pie crust. Dot with butter. Top with second crust. Brush with milk. Bake in oven at 400 degrees for 45-60 minutes or until apples are done.

YELLOW LARD CAKE

2 eggs, separated
1/2 cup sugar
2 1/4 cups sifted cake flour
1 cup sugar
3 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/3 cup lard
1 cup plus 2 tablespoons milk
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla

Beat egg whites in small bowl until frothy at high speed of electric mixer. Gradually beat in 1/2 cup sugar, beating until very stiff glossy peaks are formed.

Sift together cake flour, 1 cup sugar, baking powder and salt. Beat lard in mixing bowl until soft. Add dry ingredients, 3/4 cup of the milk and vanilla. Beat at medium speed 1 minute. Scrape sides and bottom of bowl constantly. Add remaining milk and egg yolks. Beat at medium speed 1 minute, scraping bowl constantly. Fold in egg whites. Pour batter in 2 greased and floured 9-inch round cake pans. Bake in 350 degree oven 25-30 minutes or until cakes test done. Cool in pans on racks 10 minutes. Remove from pans; cool on racks. Frost with your favorite icing.

President's Recipe Jim's Peach Pie

3/4 cup sugar
3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg or cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon almond extract
dash salt
5 cups sliced fresh peaches
2 tablespoons butter

Line 9 inch pie plate with pastry. Combine sugar, flour, spice, almond extract and salt. Add to peaches. Mix lightly. Fill shell. Dot with butter. (Dash with extra spice if desired.) Top with pastry and crimp edges. Cut vents in top crust. Bake in 375° oven for 45-50 minutes or until done.
